About the Director

Jason has been active in the Boston music scene since 1999. Currently he is an Adjunct Instructor at Emmanuel College, where his responsibilities include teaching Performance Techniques/Advanced Performance Techniques for the Singing Actor, music directing their spring production, and teaching piano and vocal lessons.

As a music director, Jason has had the pleasure to work with The Player's Ring (Portsmouth, NH), F.U.D.G.E. Theatre Company, Emmanuel College, Bentley College, Suffolk University, Milton Players and Arlington Friends of the Drama. He has also run summer drama camps through the Westwood Recreation Department, and was music director and co-director for the Angier After School Program musical theatre program.

He expanded his love of jazz under Dr. John Entzi at Northwest Missouri State University, having the opportunity to perform in Chicago, and to also take his trio up to performances in Nebraska, Missouri, Iowa and North Dakota. Jason is excited for this opportunity to be continuing his musical journey with the Jazz Band and the COF!

About the Guest Artist

Michael Moss has been a musician all his life. He graduated from New England Conservatory with a Master of Music in Jazz Performance of saxophone. Michael then founded a recording studio as his base for composing music.

As a young man, Michael was invited to tour with Cab Calloway and other jazz orchestras, playing on four continents at the world's great jazz festivals including the Berlin Jazz Festival, and renowned venues like Carnegie Hall. He has shared the stage with renown jazzmen-Dizzy Gillespie, Milt Hinton, Benny Carter, David Sanborn and many others. Other credits include Aretha Franklin, The Temptations, The Smithsonian Jazz Masterworks Orchestra and the East Texas Symphony Orchestra.

His compositions have been nominated for three Grammy nominations, and he had the honor of working with Robin Williams, Liam Neeson, James Earl Jones, Matthew Broderick, Viggo Mortensen, and most recently, John Krasinski.

Michael is an assistant professor at Berklee College of Music, and lives in Dedham with his son Benjamin and his wife, the artist Claudia Ravaschiere, with whom he collaborates on public art and sound installation art.
